Teamsters Canada Convention Discuss And Debate Bylaws Proposals

Delegates to Teamsters Canada Convention in Quebec City have considered several proposed Bylaws changes.

These Bylaws proposals were submitted to the Delegates, with the **changes clearly identified**, and new language bolded so the delegates could clearly identify the changes.

Delegates debated each proposal, one by one. Everyone had an opportunity to participate and to emphasize or express their concerns, or support in an open and democratic process.

Delegates have the ability to accept, reject or amend **one proposal at a time.**

Not all proposals were passed by the delegates, and there are very good reasons expressed by the delegates as to why that decision was made.

This is the **correct informed manner** in which to openly discuss, debate and make decisions on Bylaws proposals.

The Rail Conference Bylaws Process – NO DEBATE – NO DISCUSSION

TCRC Bylaws changes are **not identified** for the membership, you have to go and find them for yourself.

Many of the proposals are self-serving **power enhancements** for the President.

There is **no debate or no discussion.** No chance to express concerns with a single proposal.

The “Old Boys Club” held their **discussions behind closed doors**, and they **removed the definition of active membership** that required seniority.

The entire proposed bylaws **must be accepted as a package.**

The membership is being **directed to the wrong website by the President**, if they want to read the bylaws.

The President either will not or cannot publicly reveal the **cost of the Bylaws Committee** and the Initiative Process.
